***Kansas Legislative Report***

***March 3, 2023***

Warmer weather in Topeka signals spring is on the horizon and the second half of the session is underway. After a short break for Turnaround, legislators returned to the capitol on Wednesday. The Turnaround deadline stopped hundreds of bills, exempting only legislation which has been passed by one chamber or resides in an exempt committee.

The next two weeks will be focused on additional committee work. They will have to work bills at a very brisk pace in order to keep that legislation alive and ahead of deadlines. March 24 marks another deadline in which bills (unless they have touched an exempt committee) must be passed by the second chamber, reserving the last week of the month for conference committees to reconcile any differences between House and Senate versions.

The coming weeks expect to see both chambers develop and pass a budget while each chamber talks through possible tax policy changes.

Proposed dental legislation remains alive for possible consideration as SB 103 was provided an exemption to legislative deadlines. The bill, introduced by the Association of Dental Support Organizations, remains in the Senate Committee on Public Health and Welfare. SB 103 proposes to allow dentists to provide basic information about the dentist and dental practice ownership upon request of a patient and changes requirements for operating dentist offices.

In contrast, HB 2266, is not eligible for action this session due to legislative deadlines. HB 2266, introduced by the Kansas Dental Association, defines non-covered benefits under a dental benefit plan. The bill will be active again next session.

Related to licensure, no further consideration is expected for HB 2239, exempting all licensed individuals who work more than 1,000 hours a year.
